

OVERVIEW

The 2017 Improving Practice in OBGYN Annual Symposium once again has assembled a group of experts who will be speaking on a wide range of topics, including ovarian cancer, polycystic ovarian syndrome, breast arterial calcifications (BAC) as well as DVT and diabetes in pregnancy. As leaders in their field, their published work has led to practice changes which have improved patient care in obstetrics and gynecology. Lastly, the symposium agenda provides excellent education for the entire inter-professional care team in OBGYN.
