## **Keynote Speaker:**

Peri Rosenfeld, PhD, FAAN



Peri Rosenfeld, PhD, FAAN is the Director of the Center for Innovations in the Advancement of Care (CIAC) at NYU Langone Health. She works with RNs across the NYU Langone Health enterprise to elevate and expand the visibility of nurse contributions to patient care, research and quality. Located in this Academic Medical Center, with access to support and services at the NYU Meyer's College of Nursing and NYU School of Medicine, CIAC is uniquely situated at the crossroads of clinical and health services research in both hospital and ambulatory settings.

Since taking the reins at CIAC in the fall of 2015, Dr. Rosenfeld has been actively engaged in research and evaluations to examine population-based nursing innovations and patient outcomes at NYU Langone Health. In the course of her career, she has published several data books on nursing workforce and, most recently, was coauthor of *Nurses Improving Care for Healthsystem Elders* (NICHE) published by Springer in 2019. She has also published more than 80 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters and serves as review editor for Policy, Politics, & Nursing Practice; Medical Care; and American Journal of Hospice & Palliative Medicine. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (AAN), the New York Academy of Medicine (NYAM) and an inaugural Fellow of the Center for Healthcare Innovation and Delivery Science (CHIDS) at NYU School of Medicine.

Prior to her current role Dr. Rosenfeld engaged in health services research in several NYC-based and national organizations. She began her career at the National League for Nursing as VP for Research and later held a joint appointment in the NYU Division of Nursing and the NYUHC Departments of Nursing as Associate Director of the Pless Center for Nursing Research. She remains an Adjunct Professor at the NYU Meyers College of Nursing. Her 30 year career has been devoted to health services research, with specific content expertise in the nursing workforce; quality of care across hospital and home care settings; and access to care among underserved populations.

In addition to her earlier appointment at NYU, she has also held research positions at (i) the Visiting Nurses Service of New York conducting quality and policy-related studies on home and community based services; (ii) New York Academy of Medicine, studying the impact of Ryan White Act on care of HIV/AIDs patients, as well as studies on the aging nursing workforce; and (iii) NYS Council on Graduate Medical Education, which advanced public policies for increasing primary care among medical residency programs in New York State.
