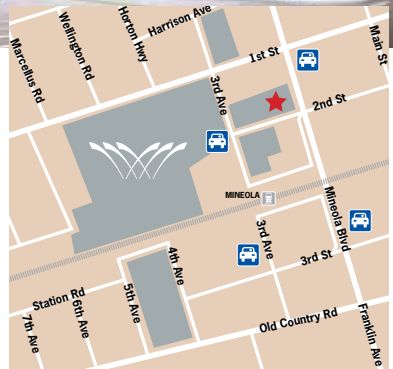
A fee of \$25 is deducted for cancellation. Refund requests must be received by mail 72 hours prior to the course. No refund will be made thereafter.
