OVERVIEW

Older adults who are planned for surgery should be assessed for cognitive impairment and functional impairment since those can impact patient's recovery and prognosis. However, many health systems lack systemic assessments to screen and diagnose these impairments. Additionally, many older adults are at risk for post-operative complications including delirium, pressure ulcers and pain. We will describe how an interdisciplinary approach involving rehabilitation professionals, nursing, physicians and case managers will improve patient care for geriatric patients. Best practices to address and support patient and caregiver needs in the peri-operative period will be demonstrated.

- Demonstrate the significance of patient and caregiver education in the peri-operative period for older adults.
- Describe the role of the discharge planner for care management for older adults who had surgery.
- Demonstrate creative solutions to challenging issues related to discharge.
