The 2019 Improving Practice in OBGYN Annual Symposium has assembled a group of experts who will be speaking on a wide range of topics, including Cervical Cancer Screening, HPV Vaccination and Its Impact, Racial Disparities in Morbidity and Mortality, Evidence for Induction of Labor, the Application of Stereotactic Radiosurgery for GYN and Breast Malignancies and Reproductive Endocrine Infertility.
